

Forest Fire: Responsible for the prevention and suppression of wildland fires. Directly fight fire using a variety of techniques and resources.

Landowner Assistance: Assist private landowners with forest management, marking and sale of timber. Help landowners access federal cost share funds for management planning and timber stand improvement.

State Lands: Manage and protect West Virginia's State Forests using silviculture.

Urban and Community Forests: Assist local communities and municipalities to manage their urban forests.
